- Copies of FAA certificates front and back.
- Aviation-oriented resume, two pages max.
- Up to two additional one-page recommendation letters.
 - One from a peer or co-worker
 - One from a client who is familiar with your work
- Supporting documents (for items listed on page two of application). Only include title pages of presentations, curricula, manuscripts, or articles (not full text). Last page of logbook or **WINGS** history is sufficient.

We are seeking aviation citizens, leaders, and consummate professionals who inspire the next generation of aviation professionals

Judges will focus on the following: **Activities** that go above and beyond normal job requirements; **Commitment** to continuing education; **Pro-Bono** service to the general aviation community. The highest scores will go to nominees who demonstrate exemplary performance, and specific contributions to aviation safety, education, and professionalism.

Note: While your résumé outlines your complete history, judges may only consider activities within the **last five years**. This award is not a lifetime achievement award; it is an **“Of the Year”** recognition.

How to present your contributions: Use the allotted space for each category, or provide a **“SEE ATTACHED LIST”** notation with additional pages; **Present** information in bullet-point format whenever possible—this helps judges quickly understand your contributions and will improve your score; **Include** supporting documentation for your most significant achievements (e.g., title pages of presentations, summaries of projects, logbook pages); **Whenever** possible, please type your submission—professional documentation reflects well on you.

We encourage you to give this your best effort. Thank you for your engagement, and best of luck in the competition!

PROFESSIONAL ACTIVITIES in the **past five years**. **Examples:** work, job responsibilities, aviation activities, etc. Activities should be relevant to the award you are applying for. i.e.: judges of REPs nominees are interested in activities that support the FAASTeam (1,000 characters max).

CONTINUING EDUCATION & DEVELOPMENT The aviation world moves fast and being a real pro requires current skills and knowledge. **Examples:** Recently earned FAA certificates/designations, recurrent/upgrade training, industry & manufacturing seminars or college/technical classes taken. Judges focus on training in the **past five years** that exceeded the basic requirements to renew FAA certificates, etc (1,000 characters max).

PRO BONO SERVICE TO GENERAL AVIATION Tell us about your service giving back in the **past five years**. **Examples:** Service on boards or committees, teaching classes, mentoring, Scouts, Young Eagles, AOPA Airport Support Network, EAA Technical Counselor, Civil Air Patrol, articles, blogs or newsletters you've written, advocacy efforts or responses to Notices for Proposed Rulemaking (1,000 characters max).
